The first seminar on the topic, "University Globalization" started two years ago to try to identify the root causes of the current weak Japan by focusing on the differences between "Japanese university education and employment systems" and those in other countries.

Through this Seminar, we want to identify more potential root causes of the weak Japan and extend our focus to weak Japanese writing capability of Japanese university graduates that has been leading to poor self expression and communications capability. The seminar is two fold: Track 1 deals issues with Japanese graduates / how Japanese graduates are different from those in foreign countries and expectations to Japanese graduates, Track 2 deals how Japanese writing skills are taught in high schools and universities compared with the writing courses in the universities in America and others.

Speakers

Mr. Walter Foreman is the Manager of Communications and Protocol at Korea University's Office of International Affairs. His chief responsibility in this position is developing and stewarding international partnerships for student mobility, faculty exchange, and research collaboration. In addition, he serves as the main liaison officer for Korea University's memberships in Universitas 21 (U21) and the Association of Pacific Rim Universities (APRU). Mr. Foreman earned a B.Ed. from the University of Saskatchewan, an MA from the University of Sydney, and is currently working toward his PhD in English Education from Korea National University of Education. Originally from Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada, he has lived in Korea since 1998.



Prof. Atsuko K. Yamazaki is Professor at Shibaura Institute of Technology, where she teaches communication related to science and engineering, and conducts research in communication and information science. She received MA in TESOL from Monterey Institute of International Studies, MS in Computer Science from University of Maryland and Ph.D. in Systems Engineering from Wakayama University. She has held leadership positions in IEEE Professional Communication Society and Japan Association of College English Teachers. Her work has been published by Ecological Modelling, Deep-Sea Research, IEEE, Knowledge-Based Intelligence and Information Engineering Systems International, Japan Society for Artificial Intelligence and others.



Prof. Yuko Oshitani is Founder and Director of Tohoku Tabunka (Multicultural) Academy, where she has been since 2010. She currently serves as a part-time lecturer in Tohoku University and teaches the International Seminar (国際共修ゼミ). She received an M.S. in Multicultural Studies in Education from University of Houston Clear Lake in 1998.

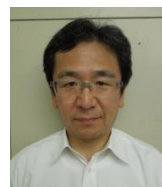

Prof. Shu Kato graduated with a Ph.D from Tohoku University and joined NTT Laboratory in 1977. Worked as a post-doctoral fellow at the University of Ottawa, in Canada from 1981 to 1982. In 1995, he established Pacific Communications Research Inc. and became President of Uniden in 1996. He became senior VP of Mitsubishi Wireless, Inc., (USA) in 1998, and established Omni Wireless, Inc., (USA) in 2001. He worked as VP, Teradyne Japan from 2002 to 2005 to learn why American companies are successful. In 2006, he joined National Institute of Information and Communications Technology to help Japanese wireless industry in global competition, and became Professor at RIEC, Tohoku University in 2008 to help fostering globally competitive Ph. Ds. He interviewed over 1,000 candidates in USA and over 1,000 in Japan for hiring so far. He has published over 200 technical papers, held over 100 patents (including a patent which became DOD (USA) standard in 1998), He is a Fellow of the IEEE.
